

# Prepare to Work: Public Safety



## Emergency Medical Technician

Train for a career as an emergency medical technician. This Basic EMT class is an essential step toward a career in emergency services providing foundation skills. This class is a combination of didactic and practical training and also will give you a first-hand look at how you can use your new knowledge and skill in the field with clinical time on both the ambulance and in the emergency room. In addition to assessments, you will learn care for medical emergencies, airway assessment and management skills, spinal immobilization, use of automated external defibrillator (AED) and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). This Michigan Certified Basic Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) class is based on 254 hours (52 of which are required clinical hours, ride time and in-hospital instruction). Required WorkKeys assessments will be given at beginning of program.

**Prerequisite:** Must be 18 years of age or older and have a high school diploma or GED. A \$10 fee will be collected the first week of class for a background check, (no felony convictions), done by our Human Resources Office. Students also must have a physical, the Hepatitis B vaccination series started by the beginning of class, a 5-panel drug screening (negative), a negative TB test and a current tetanus. These requirements are at the student's expense. **REQUIRED DRESS:** Dark blue or black slacks, a belt and a pair of shoes that have a thick sole for safety purposes.

## Paramedic Academy

The Paramedic Academy is a 900+ hour training program that includes 500+ hours of clinical and field internship following the 1998 National Standard Curriculum for Paramedics developed by the US-DOT and NHTSA. Students review skills learned in the EMT program and develop new skills, acquiring new knowledge in pharmacology, cardiology and advanced airway techniques.

**Prerequisite:** ZPFT-850 or valid EMT license. Must be 18 years of age or older and have a high school diploma or GED.
